Beginning with dinner on Thursday, June 12, enjoy a weekend of eight workshops, two group presentations, shopping, a program book, book groups, mission opportunities, guest speakers, a Gathering choir and meals, including snacks, included with a full registration of \$150.00. As an incentive to attend, the PW Presbytery will reimburse you for your full registration. Your cost would be for travel and lodging only. Rooms are \$115 plus tax per night and can be shared with up to four friends. Registration forms will be sent to PW Moderators for their PW groups and churches when available.

Our leadership team for the Gathering is worship leader, Elona Street-Stewart, Synod Executive, Bloomington, MN; music director, Rev. Kristi Holler, a pastor at Emanuel Presbyterian Church in Marion, SD; and art designer, Fern Cloud, a member of Sisseton Wahpeton Dakota Tribe living in Granite Falls, MN.

A pre-Gathering tour to the Lake Traverse Reservation includes stops at churches, Sisseton-Wahpeton College, the memorial park where an Indian Boarding School stood, and a visit to a domestic shelter. Leaving from the hotel lobby at 8 a.m. on Thursday, June 12, your cost for the tour is \$10 with your full registration. Lunch will be provided by the Dakota Presbytery PW.

Single-day registration will be available at a cost to you of \$75, meals are included and up to four workshops available to choose from. The pre-Gathering tour to Lake Traverse Reservation with a single-day registration is \$35 and includes the Thursday evening reception.

HYGIENE KITS. Here's what you'll need:

- 1-gallon resealable plastic bag
- Washcloth
- Toothbrush (in original packing)
- Fingernail or toenail clipper (packaging removed)
- Bath-size bar of soap (in original wrapping, not box)
- Travel-size deodorant (3.4 oz. or less, non-aerosol)
- Travel-size lotion (3.4 oz. or less, fragrance-free, NEW only)
- Travel-size shampoo (3.4 oz. or less, NEW only)
- Travel-size toothpaste (3.4 oz. or less, expiration date of 1 year)
- Sturdy wide-tooth comb (6" minimum teeth, packaging removed)

All items need to fit inside a one-gallon Ziploc type bag. Remove the excess air from the bag and seal before boxing.

KID KITS (formerly known as the School Kit), this includes updated supplies tailored for elementary-age children.

Here is what you'll need:

- · 12 colored pencils
- · Two-pocket folder
- Glue stick
- Blunt-tip scissors (packaging removed)
- 70-page wide spiral-bound notebook
- · 30-cm/12" ruler
- Hand-held pencil sharpener (packaging removed)
- Large eraser
- Six new, unsharpened pencils (bundled with a rubber band)
- Box of 24 crayons

- 12"x14" to 14"x17" cotton or lightweight canvas bag with handles (solid color or
- kid-friendly fabric, no logos) (can use "school bag pattern" at cwskits.org)
- Optional: Handmade or store-bought pencil pouch (tutorial at cwskits.org).

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Period Packs. Here's what you'll need:

- One 1-gallon size re-sealable bag
- Two 2oz bottle hand sanitizer
- Three 4-gallon bathroom trash bags
- One travel pack of Wet Ones
- 5 regular Tampons
- 5 super absorbency Tampons
- 12 Pads (Unscented, Long super ultra-thin) (Do not open package)
- Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger. No Ivory or Jergen's soap. Do not remove from packaging)
- One pack of flushable wipes (Unscented. 42 count)
- Six fragrance-free laundry sheets (placed in small, Ziploc bags)

Assembly Tips

- Place all items in the plastic bag, remove air, and seal.
- All items must be new.
- Do not enclose personal notes, money, or extra items in the kits.

Chandra Mendieta, (pictured) Ministries and Youth Coordinator at Bdecan, led worship. Karen Littlewind, a Bdecan church member, welcomed everyone. The church women served a traditional fry bread taco lunch. Winter outerwear clothing was collected as part of the Spirit Lake Nation's annual winter wear giveaway held at the community center. In the afternoon, we heard stories from sisters, Sharon Georgeson (pictured) and Alberta Red Fox, (pictured) about their lives in the Spirit Lake Nation and experiences/roles at the church which sits on land donated by their father. Louie Garcia, (pictured) church member, historian, and brother-in-law to Sharon and Alberta, told us about the history of the reservation, church, and the church's food pantry. Louie teaches Dacotah culture and language to middle school students and led us in songs in the Dacotah language. Donna Preston, PWP Moderator and Bdecan ministry team co-chair, shared some history about Northern Plains Presbytery's partnership with members of the Bdecan church. A partnership that includes supporting a Ministries and Youth Coordinator, maintaining the manse, working together to build the current church (pictured), adding a clothing closet building, and moving the food pantry into the original church building next door.

Sharon Johnson has ben heading up the collection of prescription bottles at the Colgate Church for over a year. As time passed, other churches and individuals added to our collection and Sharon kept washing them, sorting them by sizes and storing them at her house. On Feruary 5th she brought all the pill bottles to the Colgate Chuch and with help from Jeanne and Barb Mewes, the three ladies placed all the bottles by sizes in ziplock bags. There were a total of 1,838 bottles in bags and the bags were place in boxes. The boxes were taken to The Orphan Grain Train,103 4th Ave SE in Jamestown. The boxes will be shipped to Africa at no cost to us.The Orphan Grain Train is open on Mondays and Saturdays from 9am to noon, phone: 701 320 3259 Prescription bottles are included in shipments of medical supplies for hospital and clinics overseas where medications are wrapped in tree leaves.

Collecting Prescription Bottles: Remove labels and adhesives on prescription bottles, then wash and dry bottles and caps. Package them in plastic zip bags by size/color.

What is Orphan Grain Train: Orphan Grain Train is a 501c3 Nonprofit Christian volunteer network that shares personal and material resources with needy people in America and around the world. Volunteers gather donations of clothing, medical supplies, food, Christian literature, and other aid to meet real needs. (ogt.org)

2024 TOGETHER IN SERVICE REPORT

Fulfilling its purpose, Presbyterian Women (PW) are nurturers in faith, supporters in mission, workers for justice and peace, builders that strengthen the PC(USA) and witnesses to the promise of God's kingdom. To that end, every local PW donates financially and in-kind to organizations and benefits, offers a Bible Study with fellowship, and serves the local food pantries, homeless shelters, hospitals, fire and police departments, schools, nursing homes and Bdecan ministry.

Presbyterian Women have donated backpacks to schools and quilts to veterans, nursing homes, daycare centers, and local benefits.
